TOR for production of CBR Video: deepening the understanding of CBR

1:0 Introduction

CBR Africa Network (CAN) is an independent Non-Governmental Organisation that facilitates networking and information sharing on disability, Community-Based Rehabilitation (CBR) and inclusive development within Africa and across the World. Serving as the African regional affiliate of the CBR Global Network, CAN ideally aims to provide lessons that inform improvement in service delivery to enhance the lives of persons with disabilities.

Our niche is information sharing through conferences, a website and the social media. As one other way of promoting CBR on the continent, CAN is scheduled to develop a video documentary aimed at promoting deeper understanding of CBR as a tool for realising the Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (CRPD).

CAN envisions equalisation of opportunities, social integration and rehabilitation of people with disabilities in Africa; with a mission of promoting access to appropriate information on disability and development for all people in Africa.

Given the above, CAN is scheduled to produce a video documentary on deepening the understanding of CBR in Africa, and Uganda in particular.

2:0 Purpose

To develop a documentary examining the understanding of CBR in Uganda, detailing stakeholder perceptions of CBR and its effectiveness in promoting the CRPD.

3:0 Expected output

A documentary video produced in different versions of 2 minutes, 5 minutes and 20 minutes. The video should meet the current technological requirements.

4:0 Scope of the task

The service provider should be willing to travel to the selected districts in the three regions of Uganda to shoot the video. The consultant will

also ground him/herself on the principle of CBR, CRPD and video for communication and advocacy.

5:0 Role of the consultant

- Provide technical guidance in relation to the given task in order to realize the desired intention
- Provide all equipment's necessary for producing good quality video clip ready for broadcast
- Produce high quality video
- Conduct interviews in line with the purpose of the assignment

6:0 Management

The consultant will work closely with the Information and Communication Officer. The consultant will work back and forth while executing its tasks

7:0 Duration

The Assignment is expected to last within 14 working days. CAN will provide all the necessary Information and support.

8:0 Qualifications and Requirements

CAN is seeking to recruit the service provider with good understanding on the use of video for advocacy and communication in addition to adequate knowledge on CRPD and CBR as a development strategy. Specifically, the service provider should hold a minimum of degree in Communication or Diploma in film making.
