Mobility and Rehabilitation Course 1997-98

UNISE/Programme offers and requirements

UNISE and the MBR-programme will cover the following expenditures in connection with the course:

- All educational materials and stationary required
- Admission Requirements Payments for. Application form, Registration, Examination, Library, Medical, Certification, Identity card, Uganda National Students Association (UNSA) fee will be paid by UNISE/Programme
- Accommodation and feeding during theory studies and in connection with meetings at UNISE during the period October 1997 - July 1998. All facilities in connection with bedding are included.
- All tuition fees in connection with the course.
- Allowances for Field activities between January March for 36 days a' 6.000 shilling per day (4 days a week). The allowance is to cover for travel and lunch expenditures only in connection with visits to people with visual impairment.

UNISE and the Programme are expecting the following from the student and her/his employer:

- The employer of the student is expected to cover for the student's salary throughout the course period. UNISE/the Programme will not in any circumstances cover for any salaries.
- Late reporting will be penalised 1000 shilling per day.
- The student is expected to stay at home during the period of Project Work and Field Activities. The student are expected to cater for his own food and accommodation during the project work (April July). The students is expected to cover his own accommodation, breakfast and dinner during Field Activities (January March). The student is also expected to cover for his/her lunch expenditures when not visiting a person with visual impairment during Field Activities.
- The student is expected to cover for his/her own transports costs between home and UNISE.
- The student is expected to cover his/her own expenditures in connection with clothing, personnel hygiene, social welfare etc.

- The student is expected to bring clothing to UNISE for all weather conditions during October - December.
- The student must not leave the course without previous arrangement with UNISE or approval from the course co-ordinator.
- The student is expected to identify 8 persons with visual impairment before the course starts in October according to instructions given during the interview. The student is expected to work with the identified persons with visual impairment during the field work and after the end of the course. The 8 persons are expected to live in the area close to the student's home in order to avoid transports problems.
- The student is expected to organise his/her own means of transport during Field Activities (to the people with visual impairment).
- Admission Letter, your current identity card, originals of your certificates, 3 passport size photographs and any other relevant documents to be presented to UNISE on reporting day.
