

Leprosy situation in DR Congo

- DR Congo is the top in Africa and 4th in the world with 4237 new cases 2016.
- The majority of patients are detected with GII(Infirmities) (45% among New Cases)

The situation of Person Affected by Leprosy in DRC.

- People affected by leprosy:
 - Are isolated and stigmatised, thus excluded from opportunities.
 - Are illiterate,
 - Live in Extreme poverty,
 - Lives with physical deformities and ulcers,



empowerment of people affected by leprosy: TLM DRC experience.

Health care:

- early detection through communities,
- self care activities under community health workers,
- Community suspected leprosy cases and sending them to health centres)

<u>Technical help:</u>

 Provision of crutches, tricycles, protective shoes after evaluation of patients by community workers.

Education:

 Facilitating the education of children affected by leprosy and living with disabilities in need.

Livelihood:

- training of people affected by Leprosy and desabilities in income generating activities such as:
 - sewing, carpentry, agriculture in TLM vocational training center.

Active participation to the community opportunities:

community meetings, parties,

Advocacy:

 people living with disabilities having access to public buildings like schools, churches through the development of Access ramps.
