



University of Gondar Community Based Rehabilitation (UoG-CBR) Program 2019 accomplishments

1. Project Information:

2. Introduction:

According to World Bank and WHO report, a total of 17.6% of Ethiopian population is estimated to be living with some sort of disability. Due to the poverty, Access to rehabilitation services is very limited especially for persons with disability living in rural corners of the country. Therefore Community based rehabilitation strategy is an approach which is suitable for such countries like Ethiopia and University of Gondar established CBR.

3. Objectives:

- To enable government sectors and community level structures to become actively
 engaged in disability inclusive development at all levels and aspects of society in the
 zones by the end of 2020.
- To improve living conditions of PWDs in the zones by initiating, strengthening and supporting rehabilitation, self-development and social inclusion practices by the end of 2020.

4. Methodology/approach -

The program uses a Community based rehabilitation strategy with a holistic approach focusing on the following matrix;

5. Project activities performed – Summarize major activities of the project

• Youth with disabilities were supported with 5 months vocational training, and after the training, 24 Youth with disabilities and 13 mothers of children with disabilities got 6000.00 a start up seed money support for each for economic improvement support.

• Experience Sharing of 28 School Directors and special needs education teachers conducted for five days in Addis Ababa.

• A total of 541 children and youth getting continuous home based rehabilitation service by the program field workers and supervisors.

• Disability awareness and rehabilitation service training has been provided for government actors like; district women children affairs (46), social affair officers (24), sector disability mainstreaming to 57 focal persons of 12 districts (347 people in woreda level), 29 health extension program coordinators from 26 health centers and 61 health extensions workers.

One review workshop for university of Gondar disability related departments, more than
 30 students of social work, physiotherapy, sociology and special need have used the
 program for practice and two disability researches were supported.

Pediatrics rehabilitation training has been given for all CBR FWs and supervisors. A total of
 42 (F 35) CBR field workers and supervisors.





6. Major Outcomes of the project -

- A total of 2654 persons with disabilities have obtained better health care, education support,
 social participation and economical benefit with the rehabilitation services.
- A total 6637 people have made awareness raising programs in different disability issues.
- Disability related departments have benefited from the program for their students through research and community practices.
- More than 635 government officials and officers have been equipped with the required disability awareness.
- Schools were capacitated to accommodate the needs of CWDs and education officials, supervisors started to take action to enhance inclusion and enrollment.
- An official health extension and community worker training guideline in local language has been developed to enhance health care service provision for CWDs through early screening and rehabilitation.
- Organizations of PWDs became strong and influential in their ability to negotiate with district administration and other NGOs in their localities.
- 22 DPOs chair persons those are come from different districts in the zones have got experience sharing from Awi zone DPOs federations.
- Most district DPOs are being members of district councils.

7. Future direction-

- The program is in the process to include the remaining supervisors in the university budgetary system.
- The approach focuses on local government and capacity building hence a better sustainability outcome.
- Strong and jointly field level monitoring follow up is required.
- More focus on development of guidelines to be used by different government and community actors compiling experiences.
- Higher level advocacy and lesson sharing to scale up program best practices.
- Working on challenges of mental health rehabilitation.
